Ashley House employees walk Yorkshire Three Peaks to raise £4,000 for charity



On Saturday 3rd July 2010, seven Ashley House employees successfully completed the Yorkshire Three Peaks Challenge, raising over £4,000 for the company's corporate charity, Marie Curie Cancer Care. Their feat (and feet) and the resulting fantastic sum of money raised will help to pay for approximately 200 hours of Nursing Care.

The Yorkshire Three Peaks Challenge involves climbing the highest mountains in Yorkshire: Pen-y-ghent (2,276 feet); Wharfedale (2,415 feet); and Ingleborough (2,372 feet)

The walk takes in over 5,000 feet (1,600 metres) of climbing. It is over a variety of terrains, and even though the paths have been improved immensely over recent years, certain sections can still be very boggy and energy sapping.
